

Traffic Study

The following are high level notes from the public meeting held to discuss traffic control issues on Westheimer.

On Monday, June 6, 2022, there was a Public Meeting held at Briargrove Elementary School, led by City of Houston to discuss heavy traffic patterns cutting through Briargrove off Westheimer Road.

Leading this project is resident Anna Goodman. She filed the application and has formed a committee to oversee this project. Details of the committee are attached.

Attached is the slide presentation that was presented at the meeting. Below is the process for reducing/managing speeding and cut through traffic.

The boundaries of the study area are Voss – San Felipe – Fountainview – Westheimer. Woodway is not part of the study, as it was not part of the application.

At this time, there aren't plans to close Westheimer.

Traffic calming devices could help with traffic issues instead of closing off streets.

While the process says a traffic study is needed, it is not uncommon to need more counts. Traffic counts were done this year while Briargrove Elementary was in session. Another traffic count will be done during the summer.

The traffic counts are conducted for a full seven days, 24 hours a day.

Briargrove Patrol does have the authority to issue speeding tickets.

The neighborhood Flock system was put in place to help with crime and the patrol is using it as a tool to help them.
